On June 2011, Staff Sergeant Jarrad Davenport sustained injuries

from multiple IRAM Rocket attacks at his outpost in Iraq. Jarrad is currently recovering from his injuries at Walter Reed National Military Center in Bethesda, Maryland.

Construction of the four bedroom 3400 square foot home began in mid-May, with a target completion date of Christmas.
